

Vitreous enamelling for beginners or those with some experience. Joan MacKarell

Dates: 13th / 14th October 2018 10am to 5pm

10th / 11th November 2018 10am to 5pm

Location: My workshop in Faversham, Kent

Maximum number: 4 students.

Course details

Day 1. We will start with enamelling on copper exploring various techniques, including the use of sifting, scrafitto, stencilling, stamping, silver foils and ceramic transfers. These could be used to make jewellery at a later date.

Day 2. We will start to work with silver making a pendant, brooch or earrings. I will be demonstrating cleaning silver, preparation of enamels, wet packing and cloisonné.

You will be encouraged to bring along samples of previous work if you have any.

The fee for 2 days 10am to 5 pm is £200.00. This includes lunch, soup, salad, cheese, tea and coffee. (if you have any special dietary things please bring your own) This also covers enamels, copper, acids, purified water etc but not the silver stampings.

Tutor: Joan MacKarell.

I completed my first degree in textiles before retraining at Sir John Cass metalwork department in jewellery and enamel and where I taught as a part-time senior lecturer for many years. I am a founder member of British Society of Enamellers and was a Director of Studio Fusion Gallery for over 20 years. I have had work published in numerous books on enamel and jewellery, both in the US and the UK.

I encourage an individual approach to designing pieces using enamel. My teaching covers a broad range of traditional and non- traditional techniques.
